

END OF YEAR FINANCIAL UPDATE: As we calculate bills and salary that are due by Dec. 31 and compare that to the current balance in our checking account, we will need to raise an additional \$10,524 by the end of the year to break even. That is a very achievable target. However, that would mean starting the new year with no money in the account and no buffer. Additionally, we are behind in paying our required 2022 Apportionments to the United Methodist Church by \$12,711. This includes 1) The World Service Fund which support the boards, agencies and missional organizations that resource our UMC ministries around the world, 2) The Connectional Ministry Fund which supports our missions, programming, and staff in the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference, and 3) The General Church Fund which provides for the operations of the General Conference.

So, to pay all of our bills, salary and apportionments, we need to raise an additional \$23,235.

We are confident that we will be able to pay all of our regular bills. Our goal is to also pay as much of our apportionments as possible—rather than carrying that debt into 2023. However, Church Council has also set a target of having paid our regular bills and having \$15,000 in the checking account to start the new year before we pay those past due 2022 Apportionments to the UMC. Bills and salary will be paid, but paying apportionments will be delayed until we can start the year able to cover the January 2023 expenses.

Please prayerfully consider if you can make a special end of year gift to help us meet these targets. You can place a gift in the offering plate, mail a check, or donate online at FaithUMC.US under "Online Giving." If you are over 72 and have tax deferred retirement accounts, you could have a portion of your required minimum distribution given as a charitable gift to avoid paying taxes on those funds. This may benefit you as you finish out 2022 and plan for you tax returns. If you have any questions, about giving, feel free to contact Pastor Jason.

TOWN HALL ON PRISON DESIGN: The Peace & Justice Committee of Community Mennonite Church of Lancaster (328 W Orange St, Lancaster, PA 17603) invites the public to an informative forum 5 to 6:30PM on Wednesday, Dec. 14, called Don't Overbuild: A Townhall on Right-Sizing the New Jail. Experts will discuss best practices in bail and other criminal justice procedures that could assure that the new Lancaster County jail is fiscally responsible and no bigger than necessary. Lancaster County plans to spend \$150 million on the new jail, making it the largest county-financed construction project ever. Presenters will include Michelle Batt of Lancaster Bail Fund and the Rev. Jason Perkowski of POWER Interfaith and the United Methodist Church. Invitees include the county commissioners, the warden, the district attorney and the president judge. Attendees will be able to ask the panelists questions.

The townhall is timely because CGL, the county's project consultant, is presenting a draft needs assessment at the Dec. 15 prison board meeting. The needs assessment will be the basis for decisions about the size and design of the jail. The county plans to hire an architect this winter, and groundbreaking is slated for spring 2024.

"Lancaster County citizens have a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to engage with public officials in designing a rightsized jail based on actual public safety needs and to urge adoption of best practices that divert people from pretrial incarceration and recidivism," Perkowski said. "It is a moral truth across most faith traditions that we must take seriously our responsibility to love and care for our neighbors, including the poor who are in jail before trial simply because they cannot afford bail."
