

PASTOR JASON ON PATERNITY LEAVE: Pastor Jason & Julie have welcomed three boys into their home through foster care. In the UMC (BOD ¶355), pastors receive 8 weeks of full-time paid leave for maternity/ paternity leave that can also be spread out. So, he will begin to work half-time over the next 3 months instead of full-time paternity leave. He will continue to preach, lead the Youth Ministry & Grief Share, & teach Bible2School & Friday Bible Study. He will also respond to needs for pastoral care. However, there are other aspects of the ministry that he will not participate in as actively. Laity will fill in these gaps or there may simply be a delayed response. If committees want Pastor Jason to attend their meetings, they should let him know in advance. Otherwise, he will simply read the minutes afterwards. If you have a pastoral need, please call, email or text with a detailed message for Pastor Jason so that needs can be prioritized and responded to efficiently. Calls may go to voice mail. Leave a detailed message. During this important time in the lives of these children, Pastor Jason and Julie need to be available to get them to and from school, to visits and appointments, and to have time in the evenings to help with meals, homework, evening routines, etc. It is important to establish routines and connections, now. Pastor Jason will primarily be working on church ministry when the boys are in school. Sundays are focused on worship service and youth ministry. So, 9am-3pm Monday-Thursdays are the best time to reach him.
