

BENEVOLENCE / PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND: This is a separate fund that helps us meet the needs in our local congregation and community *as they arise*—separate from the three ministries listed above. We have helped people with rent, car payments, utilities, groceries, gas, etc. The recipient remains anonymous to everyone except Pastor Jason, but the particular type of usage is approved by the church treasurer and finance team.

COMMUNITY CARE MINISTRY: We have expanded the ways in which we are caring for our community. If you are able and would like support your neighbors during this difficult season, we will be equally splitting any gifts labeled "Community Care Ministry" between the following three ministries:

- The Lancaster City / Columbia Food Ministry and Tutoring Program distributes food to people in need and have hired Millersville University students to help tutor public school students. These programs are being partially supported by our sister churches and synagogues in Lancaster County POWER Interfaith
- Anchor Lancaster Breakfast Ministry at First UMC Lancaster distributes a bagged breakfast from 8:30-9:45AM outside their Walnut Street entrance to people who are homeless or food insecure (and previously provided a full hot in-house meal before the Corona Virus). They are feeding 100-150 people each day.
- Long Memorial UMC's Friday Night Share Food Ministry at 6 PM distributes boxes of food to
 families every Friday supporting families in Manheim Township. They are located at 2660 Lititz Pike
 in Neffsville.
